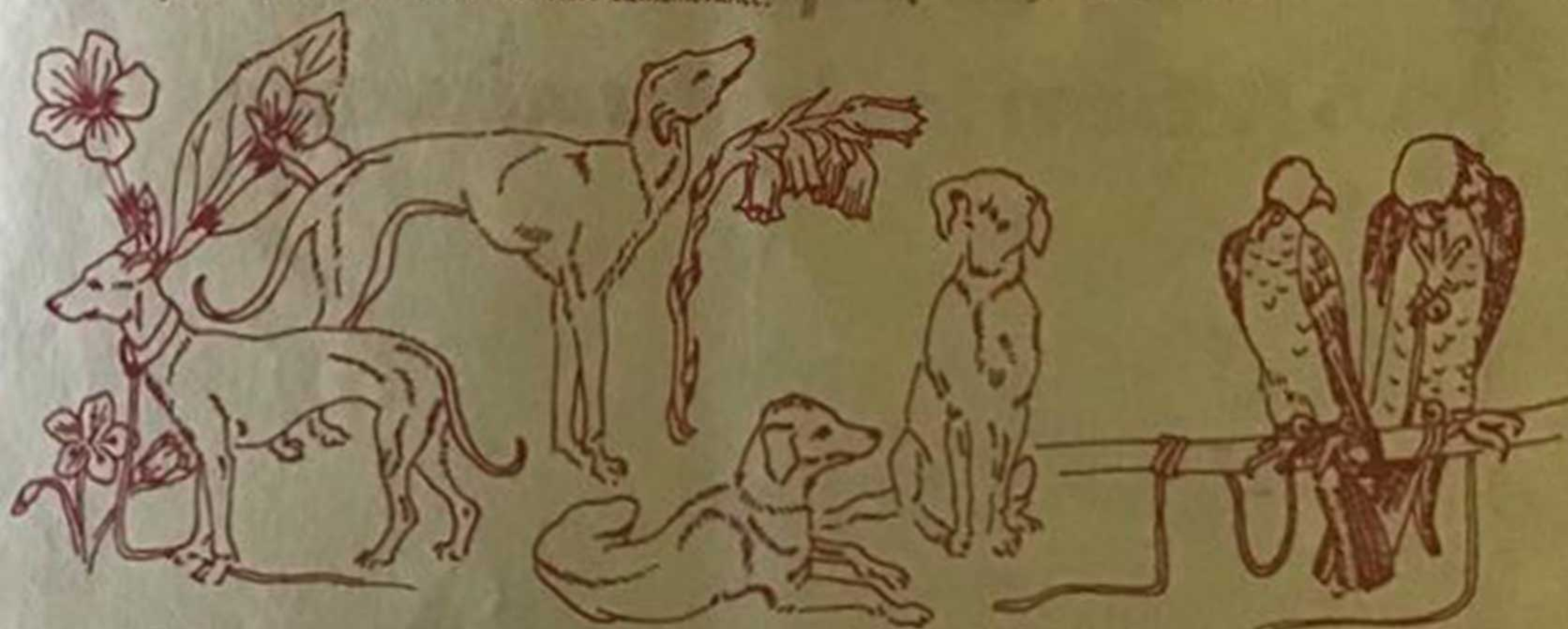
A Return to the Renaissance,

(a play in 7 acts)

Katharine the First, Part I takes place in the mysterious realm of King Richard some 400 years ago. Our story begins with the nuptial celebrations of their Royal Majesties King Richard and Queen Katharine. Katharine invites the good wizard Aurelius into the Court, and the conflict begins! The Black Coven and the Lord High Sheriff form an alliance to subvert not only Aurelius and the Court, but the entire social and political structure of the Kingdom. Throughout this "power" struggle, our good King Richard is trying to uphold justice, introduce culture into the realm, replenish the Royal Treasury, promote trade — all the while broadening his political base. Religion confronts art. A rising merchant class challenges the nobility, and stark political realities overshadow the individual cause. The military rises above social order while the citizens prepare to revolt. The marketplace becomes a battleground for the common man. Anarchy seems imminent. Will the marriage of King Richard and Queen Katharine stabilize the realm? Or will the threat caused by Katharine's introduction of art into the realm strain their bond of love beyond its limits?

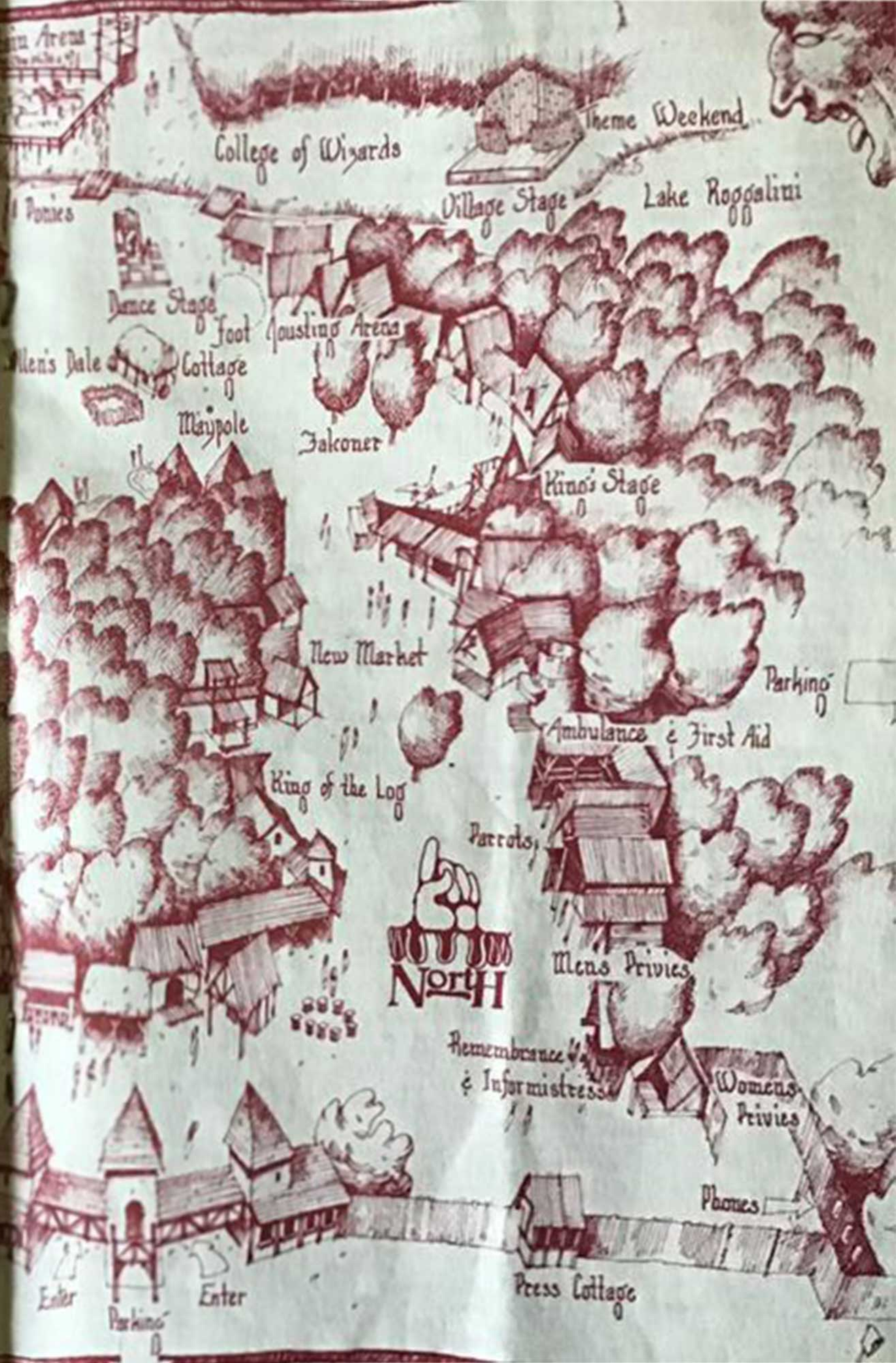
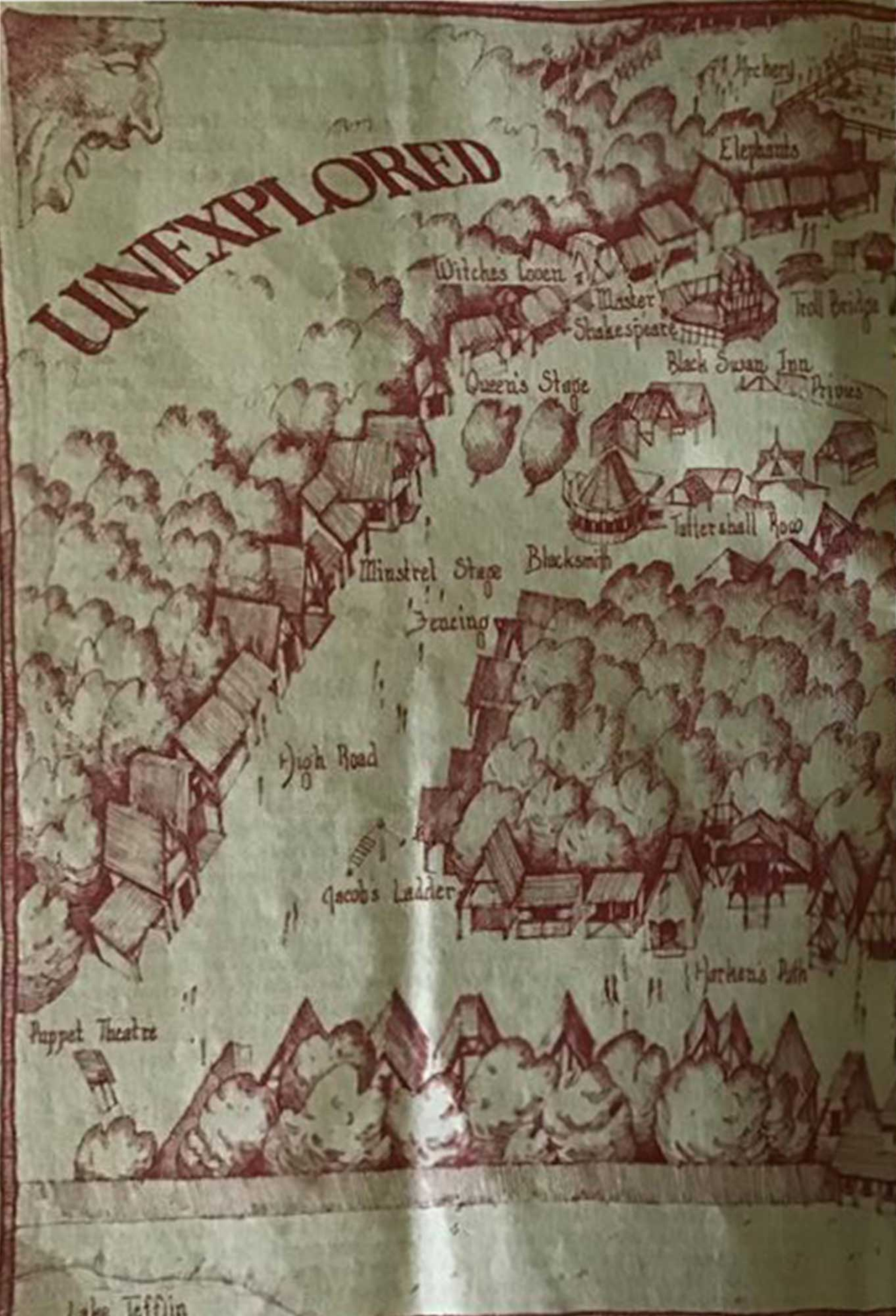

During this celebration of courtly, country and traditional dance, join with The Old Town Renaissance Consort, Balkanske Igre, and our Faire's own fine dance troupes for a weekend that promises to be one of the liveliest of the summer.

Renaissance Music Festival July 25, 26

This unique gathering of Renaissance musical ensembles will feature performances and demonstrations by The Dowland Consort, The Old Town Renaissance Consort, The Gerhart Early Music Ensemble, The New Renaissance Singers; lute performances and workshops by Steven Klein and virginal music provided by Steven Bryson.

The Tournament Games August 1, 2

Thrill to the athletic prowess of the University of Chicago Track Club as they accept challenges in nine competitive categories including, new this year, the javelin throw and strongman contest. Also included will be invitational mud wrestling for monetary awards.

The Royal Sight Hound Races August 8, 9

The races, coordinated by the Midwest Coursing Club, will occur twice each day on a new 400 foot track. On Saturday only, dogs of the realm will be invited to compete in The Royal Hound Show. All costumed dogs with costumed owners admitted free.

Harvest Carnival

August 15, 16

Great Feast — September 23, 1387 given by King Richard and the Duke of Lancaster. The cooks gathered the following provisions: 14 owen, 120 heves of shepe, 120 carcas of shepe, 12 bores, 14 calvys, 140 pigs, 300 maribones, 3 tons veneson, 50 swannes, 210 gees, 50 capons, 60 dussen hennes, 400 conyngges (lg. rabbits), 160 dozen pcions (pidgeons) 12 doz partridges, 12 cranes, 120 gallons milk, 11 thousand egges

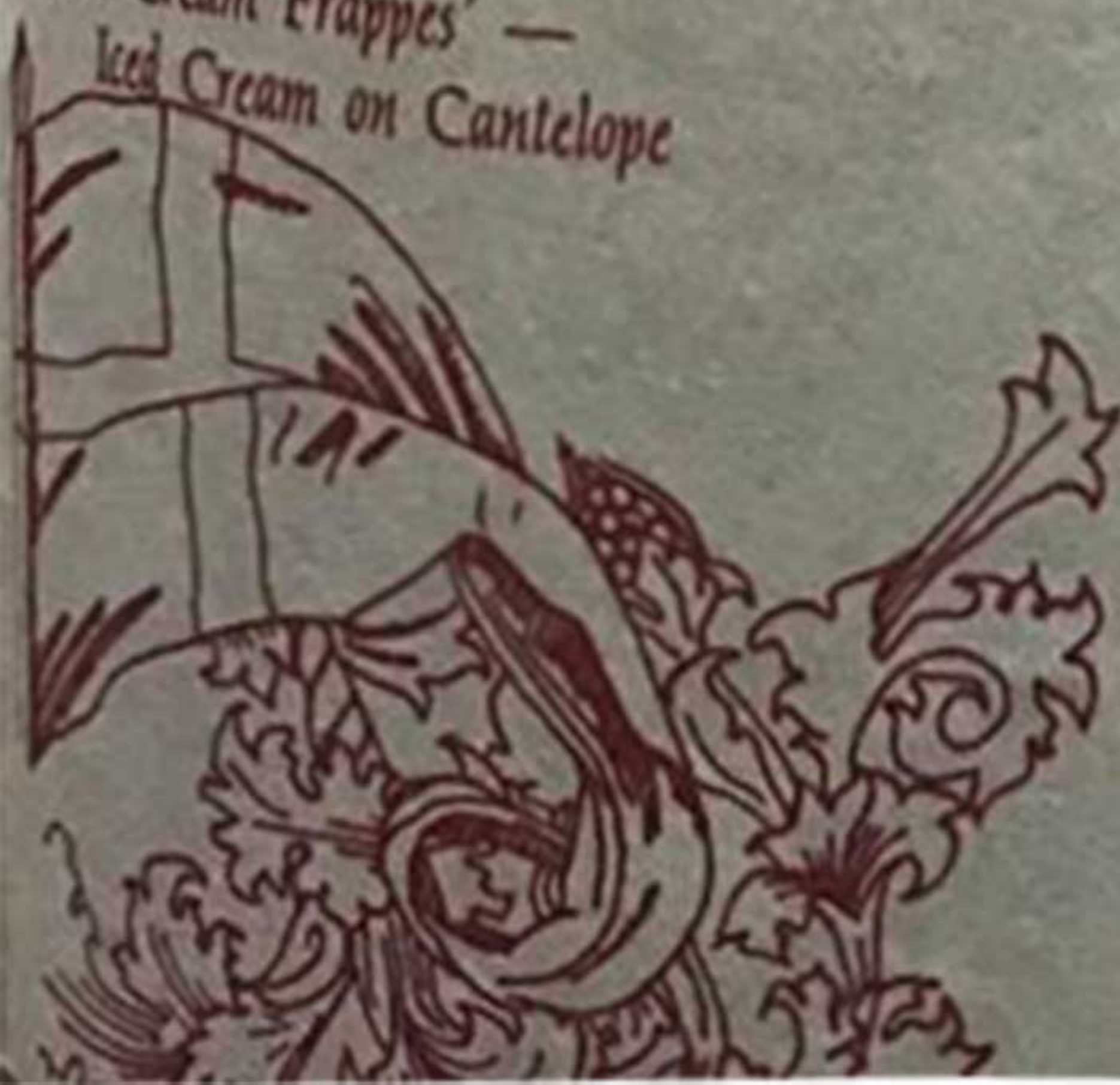
